Junior Exhibitor must pay \$1.00 exhibition fee. Entry fee \$3.00 per class. **All entries fees must be made at the Secretary's Office by August 26, 2016 at 4:30 PM. Animals must arrive after 12:00 Noon, and be in place by 8:00 PM Thursday, and remain until 3:00 PM the following Thursday.**

Stall reservations taken starting April 1 by contacting Fair Director William Gombash at 419-826-6532. Stall rent is \$25.00 per stall. Checks should be payable to Fulton County Fair, c/o William Gombash, 9298 SR 64 Swanton, Oh 43558 no later than May 1. **Any stall with a non-payment after May 1 will be forfeited. No refunds on stall rent.** All stalls must be cleaned daily. All stalls must be cleaned out completely and decorations removed on departing Thursday. No bedding will be furnished. No stalls exchanged without approval of the director in charge. **No horses/ponies allowed in the camping area at any time. NO APPLIANCES (REFRIGERATORS, COFFEE MAKERS, COOKING APPLIANCES OR ANY KIND, ETC.) ARE TO BE PLUGGED IN TO ANY BARN OUTLETS PER FIRE MARSHAL.**

Judging starts **Tuesday at 10:00 A.M.** All horses and ponies on exhibit must be shown in either Halter or Performance Classes. All horses and ponies can only be ridden once in each Performance Class. Each exhibitor must have own exhibitors number. All horses and ponies may be ridden only once in each performance class. No refunds or class changes. **No stallions over 12 months of age may be stalled or shown at this show. Please get exhibitor tags and verify your class entries at the Secretary's Office prior to the day of the show.** Back numbers are available at the entry booth the morning of the show. **Violators of the above rules can be removed from the grounds.**

ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED AT THE SECRETARY'S OFFICE UNTIL 4:30 PM **AUGUST 26, 2016 FOR DAIRY and BEEF CATTLE.** Date for computing age of entries shall be March 1 and September 1 for Dairy Cattle. Judging for Dairy Cattle starts on Monday at 12:00 Noon. Judging for Beef Cattle starts on Friday at 6:00 P.M. with 4-H and FFA first. All judging will be in the Spangler Arena. Fair visitors are urged to attend.

Entries must be made in the owner's name. Each exhibitor must purchase a season ticket, except 4-H and FFA exhibitors who must pay Junior Entry Fee of \$1.00. Entry fee shall be \$1.00 per head and shall accompany entry. As much as possible, preference of stalls will be given to early entries. All entries must be in their stalls by 10:00 A.M. Friday and remain in place until Thursday at 7:00 A.M. **NO FEED OR BEDDING FURNISHED. BEEF ANIMALS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO TIE OUT.**

Due to the large number of Jr. Heifer beef calves Class #8 will be split by weight. Calves may be weighed between 8:00 P.M. - 9:00 P.M. on Thursday evening September 1, 2016.

All animals must meet proper health requirements and be accompanied by proper health papers. These papers should be checked before unloading. See health requirements. **ALL CATTLE MUST BE DEHORND.** (This includes scurs, which are a re-growth of horn/horns from a previous dehorning, or horns, which are loose.) **NO DAIRY OR BEEF CATTLE SHOWING RING WORM OR WARTS ARE ALLOWED ON THE FAIRGROUND.** All entries in this department must be registered with their respective breed association. Each breed must meet registration standards. Certificate of registration must be presented upon request.

A minimum of 40% of contestant's apparel must be of wool or a wool blend and does not have to be home sewn. Animals must be fitted, and trained to show at halter. Decoration of animals permitted.

Release time at completion of show.

Rules of ADGA shall govern this show. The original registration certificate for all animals must be shown to show secretary prior to show. Copies will not be accepted. **NO FEED, PENS OR BEDDING PROVIDED.** A prep tent will be available. There will be no pre-show milk out. All animals shown in group classes must have been shown in their regular classes. Each exhibitor may enter more than two per class but only 2 premiums will be paid to any one exhibitor. All male goats barred from the exhibit. Entries judged on merit only. All animals will be visibly healthy; inspected and dismissed at our discretion. See general health rules for livestock. **No horned goats are allowed on the fairgrounds.** If in a dehorned goat there is a re-growth of horn, (scurs) which resembles a horn/horns the animal will not be allowed on the fairgrounds. Goats presented for exhibition must show no evidence of caseous lymphadenitis (superficial abscess), contagious exthyma (sore mouth), foot rot or any other contagious or infectious disease. These goats are not to be unloaded and cannot be shown.

Junior and Senior Get of Sire must consist of three does from each division, the get of one sire. Best three females to consist of 3 does owned by exhibitor.

1 Cup water
2 TBSP shortening
2 ¼ to 2 ¾ cups bread flour
2 tsp salt
1 TBSP Sugar
2 ¼ Active dry yeast

Topping:

1 Egg white, slightly beaten
1 TBSP water
3-4 TBSP poppy or sesame seeds

Instructions:

In large mixer bowl, combine 1 cup flour, yeast, sugar and salt; mix well. In saucepan, heat water and shortening until very warm (120° - 130°F) shortening does not need to melt. Add to flour mixture. Blend at low speed until moistened: beat 3 minutes at medium speed. By hand, gradually stir in enough remaining flour to make a soft dough. Knead on floured surface until smooth and elastic, 5-8 minutes. Place dough in lightly oiled bowl and turn to grease top. Cover; let rise until dough test ripe. Punch down dough. Divide into 4 parts. Divide each fourth into 6 pieces. On lightly floured surface, roll each piece to an 8" rope. Place on greased cookie sheets. Combine egg whites and water; brush tops of the bread sticks. Sprinkle with poppy or sesame seed. Cover; let rise in warm place until indentation remains after touching. Bake at 400° F for 15-20 minutes until deep golden brown. Remove from cookie sheets; cool.

*You can substitute instant (fast rising) yeast in place of Active Dry yeast. When using instant yeast, expect your dough to rise faster. Always let your dough rise until ripe. Traditional methods: use equal amounts: bread machine: use ½ tsp instant yeast or ¾ active dry yeast per cup of flour in your recipe.

SECOND SHOW exhibitors may begin setting up at 9:00 PM Monday. Second show entries must be in place Tuesday by 11:00 AM. Judging begins at 12:00 noon. Oral judging for juniors begins at approx. 2:00 PM. Entries may not be removed before Thursday 8:00PM. Entries will not be the responsibility of the show committee after 9:00 PM Thursday and may be disposed of by the committee.

The Arts and Crafts building will be opened at approx.. 7:00 am on Friday and Tuesday morning.

PARKING: To facilitate traffic flow, please enter Gate C. Follow the signs through the area east of the Arts and Crafts Building and UNLOAD in the designated UNLOADING ZONE.

IMMEDIATELY AFTER LOADING OR UNLOADING MOVE YOUR VEHICLE TO THE HANDICAPPED PARKING AREA where exhibitors will be allowed temporary parking privileges to set up their entries.

GENERAL FLOWER SHOW RULES

1. Department 14 individual exhibitor is open to residents of Fulton County and adjoining counties.
2. Any person 16 yrs. of age or over to compete for class premiums must have a season ticket and pay \$1.00 entry fee. Juniors 15 yrs. of age and under must pay \$1.00 exhibitor fee plus \$1.00 entry fee. All entry fees must be paid at the secretary's office by 4:30 PM Friday August 26, 2016 to enter.
3. Judging will be based on guidelines established in the Ohio Assoc. of Garden Clubs "Exhibitors and Judges Handbook". Judges decisions are final.
4. The Flower Show Committee will assist entrants with the placement of exhibits. The committee reserves the right to move exhibits. Disqualified entries may be removed from the entered class. Entries must not be moved or their position altered without the assistance of the committee.
5. While the Flower Show Committee will afford the best possible care and protection to all exhibits, it distinctly disclaims all liability for the losses of damage to exhibits or personal property of the exhibitor.
6. The Flower Show committee reserves the right to delete, subdivide or combine any class or classes if necessary. Classes having no entries shall be withdrawn.
7. In all classes, specimens shall be free of disease, dirt, dust, spray residue, dead leaves and bugs. No artificial polishing permitted.
8. Senior division best of show ribbons awarded for: Roses, Miniature Roses, Annual, Perennial, Gladiolus, Dahlia, and Artistic Design. Judges Award of Distinction rosette given in Artistic Design division, blue ribbon award not required.
9. Junior division best of show ribbons awarded for: Horticulture and Artistic Design.

HORTICULTURE RULES

10. Specimens that have been green-house grown during the current growing season may not enter.
11. All horticulture entries, including Grandmother Bouquets must be grown by the exhibitor. Ensure specimen stems fit the case and not cut too short. Vases are furnished by the Fair Board and must be filled with fresh water before being placed by exhibitor.
12. Horticulture exhibitors can only enter each class one time on the original entry tag, if you have other varieties in the same class you must enter them on another entry tag. Extra blank entry tags are available from the Flower Show Committee. Tags are to be filled out by the exhibitor with the exact same book number, entry number and class number that are on the original entry tag with the variety name (if known) for each different variety entered in the class. Premiums will not be awarded if correct entry numbers are not used or entries are in the wrong class. If you are not sure, seek help from the Flower Show Committee.
13. When a class calls for a specified number of specimens in Horticulture classes or Grandmothers Bouquet a greater or lesser amount disqualifies it.
14. An Exhibitor may not enter a cultivar in an "any other" class if there is another class for it.

ARTISTIC DESIGN RULES

15. Exhibitor may enter only once in each class in artistic design. The design must be the work of the exhibitor and well watered when placed. An off white curtain background 45" high and 18" deep provided)

16. All plant material may be obtained from any source in artistic classes, this does not include Grandmothers Bouquets which is in horticulture (see rule #10 above)

17. The plant material used is to be listed on a white 3" x 5" card, available from the committee if needed, and placed with the entry.

18. No artificial plant material permitted. Accessories may be used. No scenes.

19. No fresh plant material may be dyed or painted. Only DRIED plant material may be dyed or painted in creative designs. No dyed or painted plant materials may be used in traditional designs

20. Fresh plant material must predominate in traditional designs but not so in creative designs.

21. Traditional designs point scored as follows: design 25, color combination 25, suitability, interpretation and expressiveness 20, distinction and originality 20, condition 10.

22. Creative designs point scored as follows: conformance to schedule 15, principles of design 30, creativity 25, expression 20 and distinction 10.

The bloom should be at a 45 degree angle to stem. No center discs can show (except in the single or anemone type) and no green balled centers should be shown. Dahlias are classified by their size and measured in inches by the diameter of bloom. Exhibitors must measure diameter of dahlia to enter in proper class.

ARTISTIC DESIGN DEFINITIONS.

OWN INTERPRETATION: Is the designers own feeling, ideas or translation of the class title to be depicted from the flower show schedule. It is left entirely open and free for the designer to choose colors, plant materials, container and design type. The design could be traditional, creative or abstract. If the class requirement is not stated, it is the designer's choice to do what they wish.

CREATIVE DESIGN: Allows for creative imagination. It is the artists' use of plant material and other components, to organize the elements of design and principle of design to create an art form. The design usually shows restraint in the amount of plant material and the number of components used. It may have one or more focal areas or none at all. There may be more than one point of emergence and may include some abstract qualities. Form and shape are used in unusual ways to express original concepts.

TRADITIONAL DESIGNS: Design should have the basic art form of the sphere, the cylinder, the ellipse and the pyramid. It may be classified as a line, line mass and mass. Symmetrical designs include vertical, horizontal, diamond, oval, triangle, inverted "T", cone and round. Asymmetrical designs include "S" curve (also called Hogarth), crescent, spiral, scalene triangle, L-shape and diagonal.

USING: To employ for some purpose. No limiting quantity.

INCLUDING: Used as at least one of the components of design, as "including glass".

INCORPORATION: Synonymous with including.

SCENE: A grouping of elements to create a picture or landscape. NOT EXCEPTABLE as an arrangement or composition.

SPATIAL THRUST DESIGN – Is a creative design with a dominate volume of empty space defined by two strong, straight parallel placements of identical plant or man-made materials. The thrust may be vertical, diagonal or horizontal. The space is equidistant from the start to the end between the parallel lines. One parallel may be slightly longer than the other. Different lengths avoid monotony and balance problems. This is not a Parallel design! The design may be in one or more containers. Plant material is added on either the right or left side or both sides or base of the spatial thrust to embellish the space, but not in between the parallel lines. It is not necessary for the plant material to be identical on both sides. Space is the thrust and is what creates the design. Open area created by parallel placement of lines is void of any type of material.

There are no professional classes (person charging fees for their work) nor any professional exhibitors allowed to enter the Photography division. Exhibits can be brought to the fairgrounds on Wednesday prior to fair from 9:00 am until 8:00 pm and Thursday from 9:00 am until 11:30 am. The phot area is in the Fine Arts building. **No exhibits will be accepted after 11:30 am on Thursday prior to fair.** Exhibits must be left in place until Thursday (last night of fair) at 8:00pm. (Any exhibits found to be removed before this time will forfeit any premiums awarded). You may pick the exhibits up after this time which will be returned by the phot department superintendent. You must have your claim tickets. Any exhibits not picked up will be in the fair office for one week, then discarded.

Exhibits are limited to three (3) per person TOTAL and only one entry per class. You may not enter a photo more than once. The photos must be 8" x 10" in size and the photo must be mounted on very stiff material, such as cardboard, foam board, etc. The mounted photo must be covered with a mat 11" x 14" in size. The mat can be any color. Therefore, a completed exhibit will be 11" x 14" in size.

ANY EXHIBIT NOT FOLLOWING THESE RULES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.
